WHO SHALL LIVE? ALTRUISTIC PERSONALITIES OF THE HOLOCAUST
A PRESENTATION AND VIDEO SCREENING BY SAMUEL AND PEARL OLINER

ARCATA — *Who Shall Live? Altruistic Personalities of the Holocaust* will be a special presentation and video screening by Samuel and Pearl Oliner, co-directors of Humboldt State University's Altruistic Personality and Pro-Social Behavior Institute, on Friday, April 25, from 7-9 p.m. in the Nordstrom Lobby of the University Library.

The Altruistic Personality and Pro-Social Behavior Institute was founded in 1982 by the Oliners, who recognized the need for more research into the areas of altruism and pro-social behavior. The institute was founded with the dual purpose of studying specific examples of heroic and conventional altruism and to seek out ways to enhance altruism and pro-social behavior in society.

Samuel P. Oliner, a native of Poland and a Holocaust survivor, is a professor of sociology at Humboldt State. The institute's research director, Pearl Oliner, is a professor of education at Humboldt. The Oliners have made presentations throughout the United States and internationally.

Who Shall Live? is presented in recognition of National Library Week and Holocaust Remembrance Day (May 4) in cooperation with the Humboldt State University Friends of the Library. Admittance to the program is free for members of Humboldt's Friends of the Library, as well as faculty, staff and students at the university. A \$5 donation is requested from all others.
