Dear Interested Party:

The National Park Service is seeking comments on the enclosed environmental assessment for the Lost Man Creek Erosion Control and Disturbed Lands Restoration Plan.

The plan includes two action alternatives for restoration of abandoned logging roads in the Lost Man Creek watershed and a no action alternative. The NPS is proposing to completely or partially remove about 28 miles of abandoned logging roads to reduce the risk to park resources from failure of poorly constructed roads and stream crossings. Under the no action alternative, no roads would be removed. A third alternative involves complete removal of 32 miles of roads.

We welcome your comments on this plan. Comments must be submitted in writing by July 28, 2006 and may be sent to:
